

Fall 2021 NYS Urban Forestry Council Quick Start Grant Notice

The **NYS Urban Forestry Council** is pleased to announce available funding for communities to hold a tree planting event in the fall of 2021 celebrating Arbor Day and to establish a community-based forestry program. Communities can apply for up to \$1,000. Funding has been provided by the USDA Forest Service.

Grant Goals:

The intent of this grant is to help municipalities establish a community forestry program and to move toward becoming a Tree City USA Community, which is a program of the Arbor Day Foundation.

Eligibility:

Communities are eligible if they intend to work toward Tree City status but are lacking any of the components of the Tree City USA program. The four components include having a tree ordinance, a tree board, \$2/capita budgeted for trees, and an annual Arbor Day celebration with proclamation. Definitions and details of those components and application instructions can be found on the Arbor Day Foundation's Tree City USA website.

Projects must include:

- planting trees (see the recommended resources listed in this notice to facilitate tree species selections). **Planting must be done in the fall 2021.**
- holding an Arbor Day ceremony in the fall 2021.

Eligible expenses may include but are not limited to trees, mulch, soil, printing of a program, advertising to publicize the event.

Communities that are currently a Tree City USA or are a recipient of a previous NYS Urban Forestry Council Quick Start Grant are **ineligible**.

Selection Process and Award:

Applications will be scored competitively and awarded from highest to lowest until the funding is exhausted. 50% of the amount awarded will be paid to the awardees upon return of a signed grant acceptance form.

The remainder of the grant will be paid once a final report is submitted. The final report should include a summary of event, photos, receipts for expenditures, copies of materials related to the event and/or establishment and goals of a tree committee or board.



Applications will be scored by the following criteria:

- All paperwork received
- Stated goal of moving community toward Tree City USA certification
- DEC urban forester or QS grant committee member consulted
- Clear site photos included
- Date of event given
- Community to publicize event
- · Elected officials involved
- Clear budget developed
- Tree selections appropriate
- Consideration of "Right Tree Right Place"

Deadlines and how to apply:

Applications are due (postmarked) by **5pm on September 9, 2021** (see attached application).

Award recipients will be notified by the end of September. Awarded grant projects must be completed in the fall of 2021 with final reports submitted by December 31, 2021.
