#### VIS -- Celebrating 112 Years!

In 1910, ten women banded together and formed the Village Improvement Society of Saranac Lake in order to implement the Olmsted Brothers plan for Saranac Lake. Over the past century, VIS acquired land and created parks throughout the Village.



Park Manager: Lisa Paschke






This beautiful park is planted with perennials and bulbs. A steep triangle of riverbank is left in its natural state.

Sunset Park is a certified Urban Wildlife Sanctuary. Along the arboretum's meandering paths, visitors can view wildlife and over 35 types of trees.




## Flower Baskets & Village Entry Signs
