

Where to Find Volunteers

- Rotary Club
- YouthBuild
- Local businesses (may have community service days)
- Local colleges (often have a volunteer coordinator)
- High schools (e.g., Junior ROTC, community service hours, clubs)
- Neighborhood associations
- Word of mouth





Tips for a Successful Volunteer Experience

- Clear communication of expectations (e.g., schedule, level of effort)
- Appropriate tools and instruction
- Positive encouragement
- 2-3 hours maximum
- Refreshments
- Follow up with thank you and public recognition (e.g., press coverage)
- Good weather







How Volunteers Support the Urban Forest

- Labor for focused planting projects
- Tree council or tree advisory board
- Public education regarding the value of trees and the urban forest
- Advocates for trees and arborists in the municipal budget

Volunteers can supplement but not substitute for a municipal tree program
